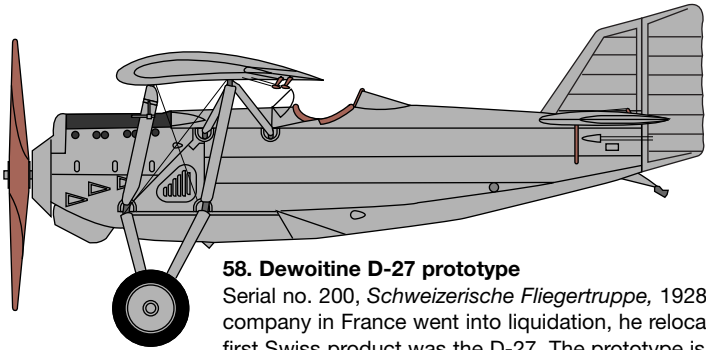
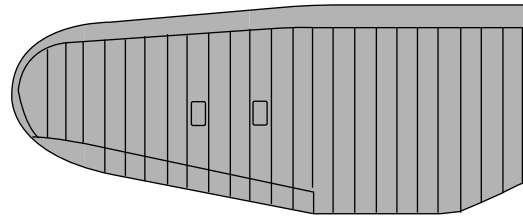


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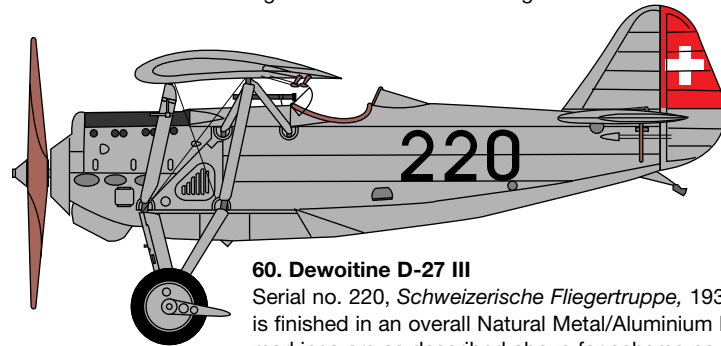
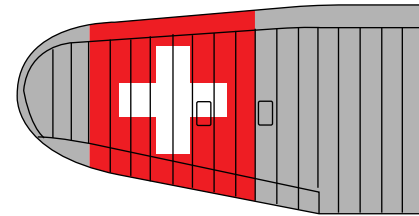
58. Dewoitine D-27 prototype

Serial no. 200, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1928. When Emile Dewoitine's company in France went into liquidation, he relocated to Switzerland in 1927. His first Swiss product was the D-27. The prototype is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. No national markings were carried at this early stage in no. 200's career. Propeller is Varnished Laminated Wood. Note the angular fin and rudder, which was altered in subsequent production machines. No. 200 continued to serve with the *Fliegertruppe* until 1936, when it crashed while being used for aerobatic training.



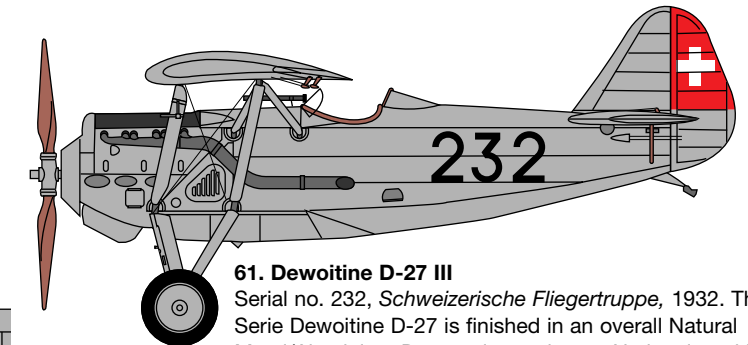
59. Dewoitine D-27 III

Serial no. 203, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1932. This 0-Serie Dewoitine D-27 is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. Swiss national colours consisting of a White cross on a Red field are carried on upper and lower wing surfaces. The top half of the rudder is Red with a White cross. Serial number is Black. Propeller is Varnished Laminated Wood. Note the curved tail profile on this production machine in comparison to the prototype.



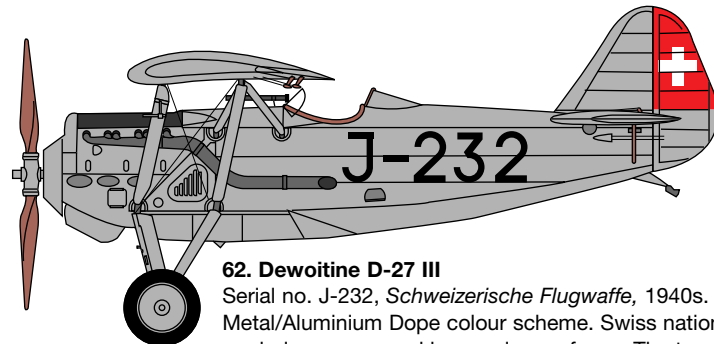
60. Dewoitine D-27 III

Serial no. 220, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1932. This 1-Serie Dewoitine D-27 is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. National markings are as described above for scheme no. 59. Serial number is Black. Propeller is Varnished Laminated Wood. Note the widened main undercarriage legs, the spinner and the additional fuselage panels.



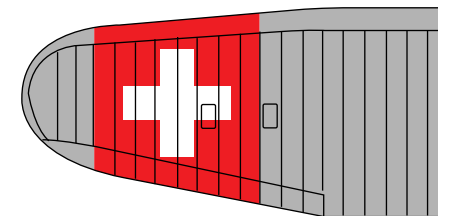
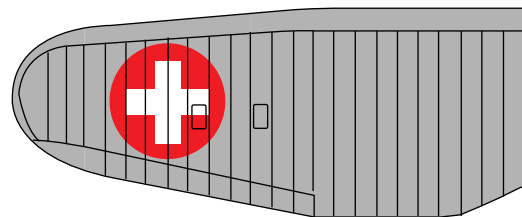
61. Dewoitine D-27 III

Serial no. 232, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1932. This 2-Serie Dewoitine D-27 is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. National markings are as described for scheme no. 59. Serial number is Black. Propeller is Black. Note the addition of exhaust pipes and a metal propeller on this fighter/bomber version.

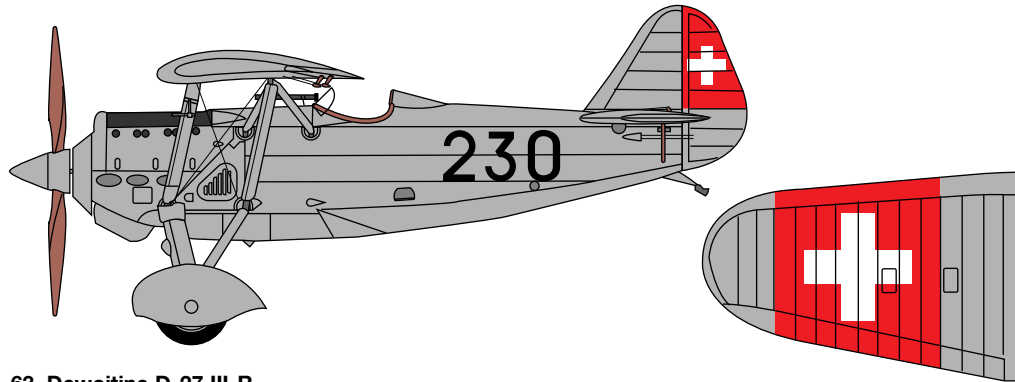


62. Dewoitine D-27 III

Serial no. J-232, *Schweizerische Flugwaffe*, 1940s. This 2-Serie Dewoitine D-27 is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. Swiss national colours consisting of a White cross on a Red roundel are carried on upper and lower wing surfaces. The top half of the rudder is Red with a White cross. Serial number is Black. Propeller is Black. Note the application of the Swiss serial number after 1934, and the wing roundels.

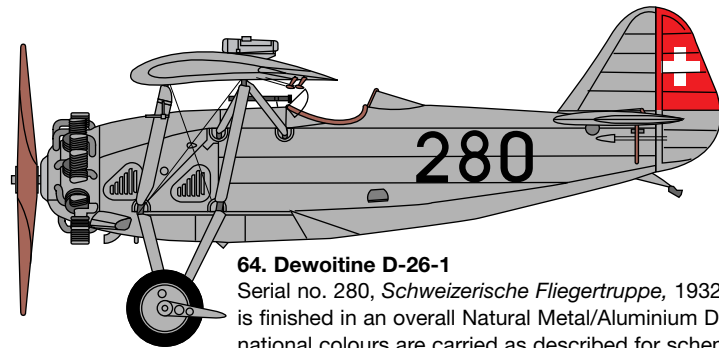


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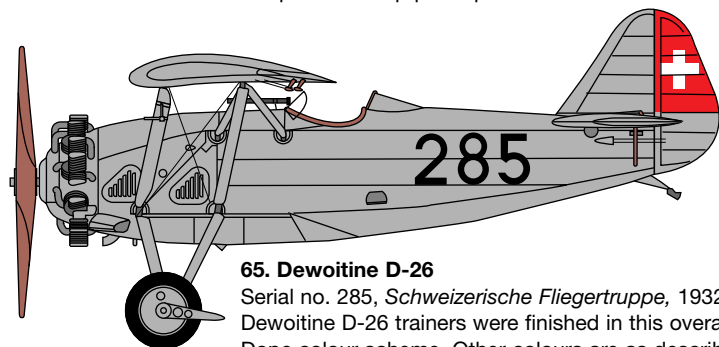
63. Dewoitine D-27 III-R

Serial no. 230, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1933. This Dewoitine D-27 III-R is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. Swiss national colours consisting of a White cross on a Red field are carried on upper and lower wing surfaces. The top half of the rudder is Red with a White cross. Serial number is Black. Propeller is Natural Metal. Note the spinner and spatted undercarriage.



64. Dewoitine D-26-1

Serial no. 280, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1932. This Dewoitine D-26-1 trainer is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. Swiss national colours are carried as described for scheme no. 63. Propeller is Varnished Laminated Wood. Note the gunnery camera mounted on the upper wing centre section. Only no. 280 and 290 were fitted with the camera, as well as an uprated 300hp powerplant.

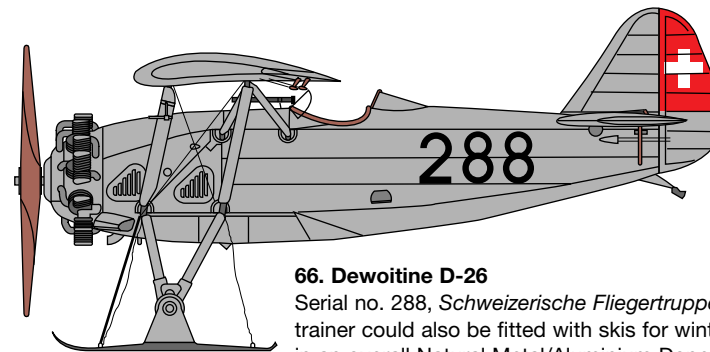


65. Dewoitine D-26

Serial no. 285, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1932. The remaining nine Dewoitine D-26 trainers were finished in this overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. Other colours are as described above.

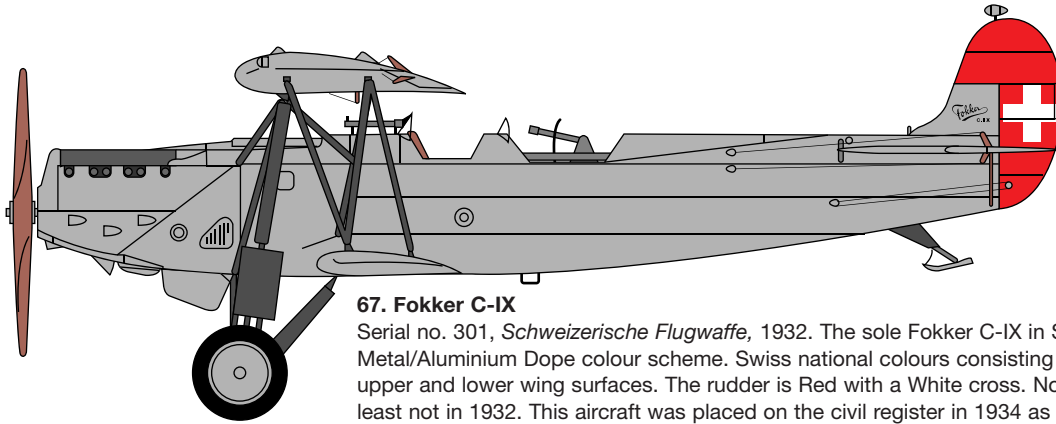

66. Dewoitine D-26

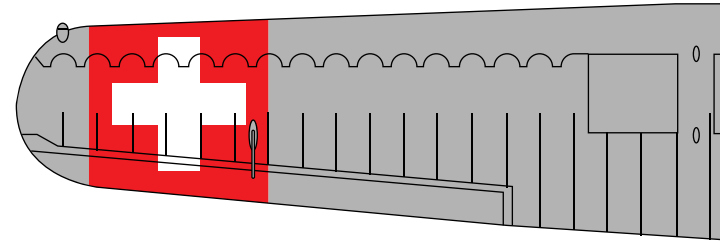
Serial no. 288, *Schweizerische Fliegertruppe*, 1932. The Dewoitine D-26 trainer could also be fitted with skis for winter use. The machine is finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. National markings are as described above for scheme no. 63. Serial number is Black. Propeller is Varnished Laminated Wood. Skis are Dark Grey/Black .

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67. Fokker C-IX

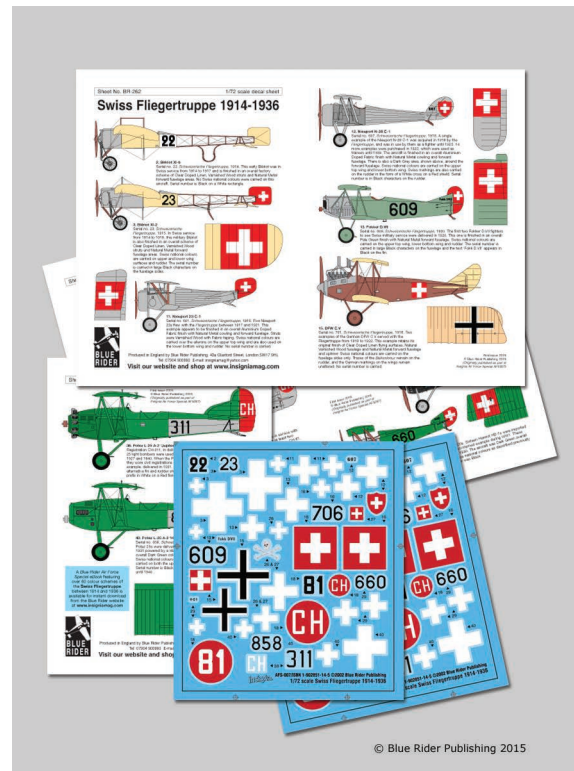
Serial no. 301, *Schweizerische Flugwaffe*, 1932. The sole Fokker C-IX in Swiss use was finished in an overall Natural Metal/Aluminium Dope colour scheme. Swiss national colours consisting of a White cross on a Red field are carried on upper and lower wing surfaces. The rudder is Red with a White cross. No serial number appears to have been carried, at least not in 1932. This aircraft was placed on the civil register in 1934 as CH-301. It continued to serve until 1947. Propeller is Varnished Laminated Wood. Struts are Dark Grey/Black.
